

Cabe Outpost Policy.

April 2003

References to Guide to Safe Scouting , BSA #34416C c. 1998, 2002 revision

Introduction

The outpost's primary presumed intended use is for Council and District group activities. These will include but not be limited to Day and Weekend Cub and Webelos Camp, Fun with Son, Camporee and OA Fellowship. Because of the wide age range of intended users of the outpost, the usage policy must vary based upon the group. The policies set forth by the *Guide to Safe Scouting BSA #34416C c. 1998, 2002 revision* will be adhered to as the minimum policy. The following guidelines are defined as further restrictions for safety and good stewardship.

Fires

Fires will only be permitted on the ground level and fires, other than stoves and grills, are to be built only in the designated fire pit. Only ashes are to be left in the fire pit. Fire extinguishers and fire buckets will be available for use anytime a fire or stove is in use.

Cleanup

The outpost will be treated as a leave-no-trace site: 'Take only pictures leave only footprints'. Any equipment in need of repair must be reported to the camp ranger or to a Scouting professional.

Inspection

A pre-use inspection will be conducted to establish that all is in good repair and that all fire extinguishers are in place. Following the activity a follow-up inspection will be performed before a refund of any deposit can be made. All inspections are to be conducted with a representative of the Council.

Fees and Deposits

There will be a \$15 per day usage fee to be charged for normal up-keep of the facility. Along with the application for use of the facility, a \$75 deposit will be collected. This deposit may be forfeited for failure to comply with these guidelines or to cover any damage to the facility.

Cub Scouts

During Cub Scout and Webelos use of the outpost, there will be continuous 2 deep adult supervision inside the facility.

Camp Kitchen Policy

April 2003

Introduction

The kitchen's primary presumed intended use is for Council and District group activities. These will include but not be limited to Day and Weekend Cub and Webelos Camp, Fun with Son, Camporee and OA Fellowship. Pack, Troop, and Crew usage of the kitchen is acceptable for pre-approved special activities. The policies set forth by the *Guide to Safe Scouting BSA #34416C c. 1998, 2002 revision* will be adhered to as the minimum policy. The following guidelines are defined as further restrictions for safety and good stewardship.

Inspections

A pre-use inspection will be conducted to establish that all is in good repair and to explain proper procedures for equipment. Following the activity a follow-up inspection will be performed before a refund of any deposit can be made. All inspections are to be conducted with a representative of the Council.

Clean-up

Upon leaving the facility, all trash must be removed from camp. In the kitchen all equipment must be cleaned, leaving nothing in the stoves, freezer or refrigerator. All camp owned utensils and cookware must be washed clean, dried, and properly stored in their designated place. All trash containers will be washed and a fresh trash bag put in place. All splash walls counter tops and sinks will be cleaned and floor mopped. No donations of pots, pans, utensils, or food will be accepted following an event. Arrangements for such donations must be made through the council office and the Camping Committee.

Fees and Deposits

The graduated fee for facility use is as follows:

Number of people	Fee
Up to 200	\$ 45
Up to 400	\$ 65
Up to 600	\$100

Along with the application for use of the facility, a \$100 deposit will be collected. This deposit may be forfeited for failure to comply with these guidelines or to cover any damage to the facility or the equipment there in. Deposits will be returned by mail through the Council office.
